## Potholes and Yellow lines

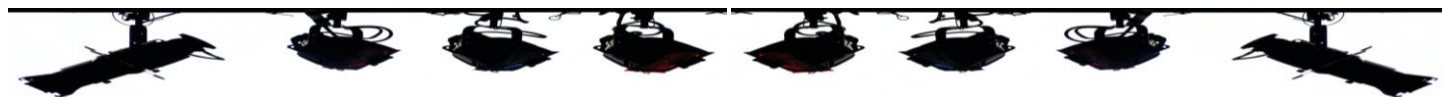
We have been successful in having the large potholes in front of the school repaired as well as having the yellow lines repainted. This will hopefully make the entrance into the school carpark safer for everyone.
