Reminder: School Reports

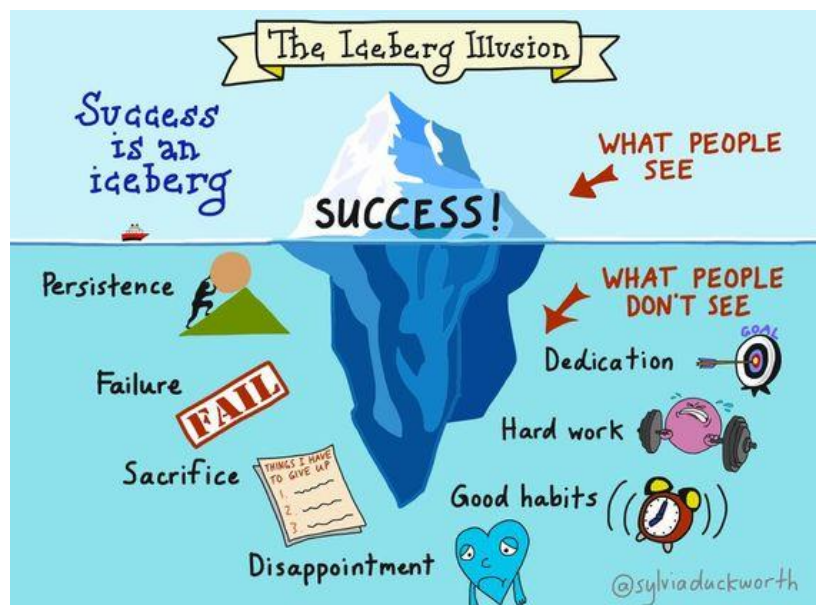

More Information about Growth Mindsets

Having a growth mindset is like having a 'can do' attitude to learning and life in general. Sometimes we might have a fixed mindset about some things. For example, believing that you are no good at mathematics, or drawing, or music, or sports.

Sometimes people might say that an accomplished mathematician, artist, musician, or sports person is 'talented'. However, what often isn't shared, is the backstory of the talented person. The story of the determination, perseverance, failures, and practice that went into accomplishing success.

This "Iceberg Illusion" diagram provides a visual representation of this idea. We think it would help support your child's learning if you were to share a backstory for something that you learned to do well. Use the diagram as a guide for what to include. Have fun sharing your experiences with your child/ren!!
