What happens at Te Uku School?

At Te Uku School we follow MSL (from the Institute for Multisensory Language Education). We are an ADA accredited school. Most of our staff are fully qualified and many have AMADA accreditations.

Structured literacy, through MSL, is how we teach reading and writing in the first 2 years of school. Students develop foundational literacy skills that support with both reading and writing. It benefits ALL learners, including students with dyslexia, and those struggling to develop these skills.

Why a Multisensory Approach? Why IMSLE?

The research behind IMSLE is based on neurological development (not damage), which includes students with dyslexia.

IMSLE is appropriate for all students in all teaching and learning situations. This approach is language based, multisensory (V-A-K), structured, sequential, cumulative, cognitive, and flexible.
